

# Florida Kraze Krush 2020 Alliance Cup Tournament COVID-19 Safety Protocol

September 10, 2020

Florida Kraze Krush (FKK) wants to create the safest environment possible for all families and athletes during our upcoming Alliance Cup tournament. This protocol is strictly for the FKK Alliance Cup.

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- 1) TWO parents/guardians per athlete, siblings are welcome to join.
- 2) No benches will be provided on the sidelines for players.
- 3) Tents tents may be brought into the complex, maximum of 2 spectators per tent.
- 4) All Players and spectators will have their temperature check when entering the facilities and receive a color-coded armband each day.

## **GENERAL GUIDELINES** to be followed by all:

- 1. All players, parents, coaches, and officials should monitor symptoms at home prior to the event. If they are experiencing illness, including COVID-19 symptoms, the individual should stay at home.
- All players, parents, coaches, and officials should monitor their temperatures at home.
  DO NOT attend the event if you have a temperature over 100.4 degrees or greater.
  Temperatures will be checked at the entrance.
- 3. Players, parents, and referees should take advantage of the handwashing stations and regularly wash or sanitize their hands.
- 4. General hygiene practices should be adhered to in an effort to mitigate the transmission of communicable diseases.
- 5. Players, parents, and officials are encouraged to bring their own hand sanitizer and water bottles.
- 6. There will be **NO** bleachers for parents or benches provided for players.

#### **SPECTATOR Guidelines:**

- 1. The event will be allowing **TWO** parents/guardians (siblings can join) per athlete at the tournament to reduce social gathering and assist with social distancing.
- 2. Upon arrival, each player and parent will have their temperature checked, and the parent can accompany the player to the field, or they can go back to the car and wait for the game to start. If the parent elects to go back to the car, then they will be given a

- wristband and can enter just at their leisure. Only parents with wristbands or those accompanying players will be permitted.
- 3. Additionally, all licensed coaches, referees, and members of soccer club Boards' of Directors are automatically approved with ID.
- 4. All spectators will have their temperature checked when entering the park. If the individual's temperature is above 100.4; they will not be admitted to the fields.
- All spectators MUST adhere to County rules when entering the park and wear a mask, no exceptions.
- 6. We respectfully request that **ALL** spectators continue to wear face coverings while present at the fields.
- All spectators should **ALWAYS** maintain social distancing during arrival, competition, and departure.
- 8. All spectators are asked to remain 6 feet apart during games.
- 9. Once the game is over, spectators should depart immediately to an open area in the park or back to their cars.
- 10. Spectators should take advantage of the handwashing stations and regularly wash or sanitize their hands.
- 11. Tents are allowed. However, no more than two spectators are permitted under a single tent.

#### **TEAM Guidelines:**

- 1. There will not be pre or post-game handshakes. Teams are encouraged to clap for each other off the field as a sign of respect.
- 2. Physical contact should be avoided during celebrations.
- 3. Coaches should practice social distancing on the sideline with their players keeping 6 feet apart.
- 4. All passes, rosters, and medical release forms should be handled by the team manager only.
- 5. Teams **SHOULD NOT** enter the sideline until the previous team has departed.
- 6. Once the game is over, teams should leave the sideline immediately.
- 7. Place all bags 6 feet apart on the sideline.
- 8. It's recommended that all coaches wear face coverings.
- 9. It's recommended players not on the field of play wear face coverings.
- 10. Players should bring their hand sanitizer and use before pre-game, at halftime, substitutions and post-game.
- 11. Each player should be assigned individual pinnies/vest for the entirety of the tournament.
- 12. Substitutes waiting to enter the playing field should place their pinnie/vest in their bag before leaving the bench area.
- 13. If the substitute fails to put their pinnie/vest in their bag, the player leaving the field should not take the substitute's pinnie/vest.
- 14. No benches will be provided at any facility.

# **REFEREE Guidelines and Protocols:**

- 1. All referees will have their temperature taken upon entering; if it exceeds 100.4 degrees, they will not be allowed on the fields.
- 2. It is recommended referees do not engage in conversation with spectators who are not wearing face coverings.
- 3. Referees may talk to coaches from a distance of 6 feet or more.
- 4. It is recommended that AR's wear masks when working on the sidelines if they are comfortable with it.
- 5. All referees are required to wear a mask to and from their fields.
- 6. It is recommended referees not share equipment whistles, flags, or jerseys.
- 7. Referees should bring all jerseys red, green, blue, yellow, etc.

# **REFEREE Game Requirements:**

- 1. Referees should wear a face covering while at the fields and during a game if they are
- 2. comfortable.
- 3. Only one referee to handle check-in pre-game.
- 4. Ensure no more than two coaches/managers are present in each team area.

## **TRAINER Instructions:**

- 1. Trainers will be onsite to assist players with injuries; there will be no pre-wrap services.
- 2. One player at a time will be allowed in the trainer area.
- 3. Injured Players:
  - a. If a player is injured on the field, the referee will signal the coach to come onto the field.
  - b. Only one coach may enter the field and must be wearing a mask.
  - c. Players with minor injuries should be moved from the field by the coach.
  - d. If an additional person is required to help the player off the field, the coach needs to select a player from his/ her team to help, and the player must wear a mask.
  - e. If athletic trainers are present for the game, he/she should be treating the injured player(s) at their respective team areas.
